Hon. High courts questions the Redevelopment

In the background of large scale and frequent violations of Delhi Master Plan 2021, Hon. High Court has asked:

'The DDA shall explain as to how the use of a residential area (Kidwai Nagar) is changed to commercial'

'Respondents shall state...number of vehicles at present against the number expected to access the area after redevelopment'

'Population density projection' for the area & the change in num. of families and individuals after #redevelopment

'DDA has undertaken massive construction activity of flats in Delhi...we are not sure that these flats stand utilised...' and has asked for project wise figures

'How equivalence is drawn between a fully grown tree and a sapling'

'Despite alarming levels of air pollution....traffic congestion...
no land for dumping solid wastes.... Water and electricity supply
in short supplies...the respondents appear to be bent upon putting
unwarranted pressure on the existing system'

- Ask them to show the Forest Department permission letter
- No permission, then Call 100 and wait till help arrives.
- Write a letter to the APCCF and CC to the DCF of your area.
- If they have permission, take the supervisors details who must be present there and contact the Forest Department .

De-Choke Trees

The Hon'ble National Green Tribunal in its order dated 23rd April 2013 has directed all Public Authorities to ensure that all the sign boards, names, advertisements, any kind of boards or signage's, electric wires and high tension cables or otherwise are removed from the trees

They shall also ensure that the concrete surrounding the trees within one meter of the trees are removed and all the trees are looked after well and due precaution is taken in future so that no concrete or construction or repairing work is done at least within one meter radius of the trunk of trees.
