

Did you know it is illegal to cut trees? Greater Kailash RWA was fined Rs. 60,000/- for cutting trees.





Trees don't walk!

Relocating houses is a major inconvenience for us, but for birds and trees a relocation a.k.a transplantation means sure death.

Relocated trees have a 1% survival rate and the birds living on them usually end up losing their nests and lives, because proper inspection prior to transplantation is never done.





Tar NOT OK Please

National Green Tribunal: We direct the Public Works Department to remove concrete within 1m of trees and ensure no construction, concretisation or repair work is done within 1m of trees.

PWD: Puts hot tar within 1m of trees on C.V. Raman Marg New Friends Colony.



De-Choke Trees

The Hon'ble National Green Tribunal in its order dated 23rd April 2013 has directed all Public Authorities to ensure that all the sign boards, names, advertisements, any kind of boards or signage's, electric wires and high tension cables or otherwise are removed from the trees.

They shall also ensure that the concrete surrounding the trees within one meter of the trees are removed and all the trees are looked after well and due precaution is taken in future so that no concrete or construction or repairing work is done at least within one meter radius of the trunk of trees.

WHAT TO DO IF A TREE IS **BEING CUT**

- -Click pictures
- -Tell them to stop immediately
- -Ask them to show the Forest Department permission.
- -No permission, then Call 100 and wait till help arrives.
- -Write a letter to the Forest Department
- -If they have permission, take the supervisors details who must be present there and contact the Forest Department.
