GOREGAON-MULUND LINK ROAD

BMC proposes to fell, transplant 811 more trees

THE BMC proposes to fell and transplant 811 additional trees in eastern parts of the city for the construction of the Goregaon-Mulund Link Road (GMIR). With this, the total number of trees to be affected by the project has reached 1.347.

In the last eight months, this is BMC sthird proposal on felling and transplanting trees for the project. According to the pro-

project. According to the pro-posal, while 66 trees will be felled, 745 will be shifted to other felled, 745 willbe shifted to other places, as they are coming in the way of widening and construction of the link road between Airoll Junction on Eastern Express Highway and Tansa pipeline at Khindipada in Mulund West.

On November 12, the civic body had issued a notice inviting larger stress and objections from

suggestions and objections from the people of Mumbai on the proposal. "The deadline for sendthe people of Mulmai on ture proposal. The deadline for send-ing suggestions and objections got over on Wednesday. Now, these suggestions will be scruti-nised before the proposal is sent to the Tree Authority for final ap-proval," said an official from BMC's garden department. In March, a public notice for felling and transplanting 154

THE GMLR project will also affect a reserved forest of about 19 hectare at SGNP in Borivali, as two tunnels will pass through the forest area. For this, the forest area. For this, the civic body will conduct compensatory afforesta-tion in Chandrapur as a prerequisite to get per-mission from state forest department to construct a tunnel under SGNP.

trees between Oberoi Mall on Western Express Highway and Film City in Goregaon was pub-lished for residents' suggestions and objections. On June 9, an-other public notice was issued for the felling and transplanting of 382 trees from Airoli junction to Tansa Pipeline at Khindipada in Mulund West.

The BMC plans a 13.65-km GMIR to ease traffic on Mumbai's east-west connectors. It would be

the fourth such connector in the city with the project costing Rs 6,225 crore. The existing road from Western Express Highway to Film City in Goregaon will be connected to Amar Nagar in

connected to Amar Nagar in Multund West and further to Eastern Express Highway. In 2014, the project had faced opposition from green activists and residents as it was passing through Aarey Milk Colony and required the felling of over 1,000 trees. Following protests, in 2016. trees. Following protests, in 2016, the civic body changed the align-ment of the project and decided to build a tunnel under the to build a tunnel under the Sanjay Gandhi National Park (SGNP) to protect the green cover in Aarey. Interestingly, at that time, officials had said that no trees will be felled for the project. Tree activist Zoru Bhathena sidthat imagine case; these that

said that in many cases, trees that are not affected by a project are also felled. Im many cases, when we inspect, we find that trees not coming in the way of a project are also felled. This happens when the proposals come from BMC's departments," he added. "Also, the BMC transplants these trees to some other less.

De-Choke Trees

The Hon'ble National Green Tribunal in its order dated 23rd April 2013 has directed all Public Authorities to ensure that all the sign boards, names, advertisements, any kind of boards or signage's, electric wires and high tension cables or otherwise are removed from the trees.

They shall also ensure that the concrete surrounding the trees within one meter of the trees are removed and all the trees are looked after well and due precaution is taken in future so that no concrete or construction or repairing work is done at least within one meter radius of the trunk of trees.

- -Click pictures
- -Tell them to stop immediately
- -Ask them to show the Forest Department permission.
- -No permission, then Call 100 and wait till help arrives.
- -Write a letter to the Forest Department
- -If they have permission, take the supervisors details who must be present there and contact the Forest Department .
