





Last month, the founder of NDNS was featured on prominent radio channels, Radio One 94.3 and Big FM 92.7, discussing the organization's impactful work in nature conservation. The conversations highlighted the profound influence of simple acts, like embracing a tree, in fostering a stronger connection with nature and a dedicated commitment to tree preservation. NDNS's month-long workshop series stood out, culminating in the impressive planting of almost 1000 trees, a collaborative achievement spanning various age groups. Beyond ecological benefits like improved air quality, the talks emphasized the notable appreciation in property value resulting from these tree-planting endeavors.

Conversations also revolved around strategies to counter environmental degradation, promoting shifts away from polluting activities toward practices like terrace gardening for a more balanced lifestyle. The discourse covered recent deforestation trends and the pressing need for reversal, alongside innovative approaches to efficiently manage waste, transforming it into valuable resources such as organic fertilizers and upcycled products. Ultimately, the interviews resonated a clear message: safeguarding nature, our shared home, is a fundamental duty, crucial for a healthy and serene life.

One sunny morning, the NDNS team led students from Modern School Vasant Vihar on an engaging nature walk and tree plantation event at Tughlakabad Biodiversity Park. Dr. Vivek, the park's leading Scientist, welcomed the students, offering an introduction to the park and providing them with NDNS Delhi-birds field guides.

Guided by Dr. Vivek, the students discovered the importance of biodiversity and the intricate role each organism plays in ecological balance. The park transformed into a living classroom, showcasing native flora, towering trees, insects, and diverse bird species. Some students even used the bird field guide to identify these birds, while also learning about the park's natural water treatment processes.

Following the walk, the students eagerly participated in tree planting with native saplings, actively contributing to conservation efforts. Such events, involving students as nature's future stewards, foster a sense of responsibility for the environment and its preservation.

Discussion on "C20: Role of Health Professionals and Civil Society in reducing Air Pollution and building Climate Resilience"



On Thursday, O3.08.2023, CAN South Asia hosted an event in collaboration with Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Health Care Without Harm, Lung Care Foundation, EnGIO and Warrior Moms, with the blessings and guidance of Sri Mata Amritanandamayi Devi, C20 Chair - under the Civil 20 Working Group on "Sustainable and Resilient Communities - Climate, Environment and Net Zero Targets" discussing the "C20: Role of Health Professionals and Civil Society in reducing Air Pollution and building Climate Resilience.

The speakers who attended the event addressed the adverse condition of air pollution, the pollutants that we breathe in, and how harmful it is for the citizens.

We addressed the audience by telling them the importance of trees, how the authorities can improve the functioning of the helplines, and how concretization of trees has still not been removed.



FOREST BILL

A Forest isn't just a collection of trees, it's a tapestry of life that weaves together ecosystems, cultures, and generations. Forests are known for the valuable goods and services that they provide to mankind and the environment including raw materials, timber, food, carbon capture, oxygen, and much more.

To safeguard the existing forest from over-exploitation, the government in the 1970s introduced the forest act, which empowers the government to classify forests into reserved forests, village forests, protected forests, and other similar categories for their usage and also to regulate and check the illegal cutting down of trees for the raw materials like timber.

Be Dear To Deer

The spotlight has shifted to Deer Park in Hauz Khas, where an intriguing question has arisen: Who's removing the deer from Deer Park? Recent reports have brought to light a significant change that's raising eyebrows – the proposed relocation of over 600 deer by the Central Zoo Authority (CZA). This move would essentially strip the park of its defining feature and reputation as a haven for these graceful creatures. The reasoning behind this decision points to alleged overpopulation, mismanagement under the DDA, and space constraints.

At first glance, the notion of transferring the deer to a more expansive area, allowing them to roam within their natural ecosystem, might seem reasonable. However, delving deeper, it's essential to assess whether this shift truly serves the best interests of the deer or if it's simply a way for authorities to offload their responsibilities. The situation prompts a careful consideration of what's genuinely in the best interest of these animals and the integrity of the park's legacy.



De-Choke Trees

The Hon'ble National Green Tribunal in its order dated 23rd April 2013 has directed all Public Authorities to ensure that all the sign boards, names, advertisements, any kind of boards or signage's, electric wires and high tension cables or otherwise are removed from the trees.

They shall also ensure that the concrete surrounding the trees within one meter of the trees are removed and all the trees are looked after well and due precaution is taken in future so that no concrete or construction or repairing work is done at least within one meter radius of the trunk of trees.

A TREE IS BEING CUT?

- -Click pictures
- -Tell them to stop immediately
- -Ask them to show the Forest Department permission.
- -No permission, then Call 100 and wait till help arrives.
- -Report the matter on the Green Helpline 1800118600
- -Write a letter to the Forest Department
- -If they do have permission, then take the supervisor's details who must be present there and contact the Forest Department.
